- Establish it as an issue
  - Death and Taxes (2008) Christian Aid
    - First significant report by Christian Aid on tax
    - Launched our tax campaign
    - Instrumental in making tax a development issue
      - But only in a limited constituency
      - Had substantial backlash



- To investigate further
  - Noticed that something strange going on with copper prices in <u>Zambia and</u> <u>Switzerland</u>.
  - Investigated further <u>Swissploitation</u> (2013)
    - Showed how prices of commodities being sold via Switzerland effectively transfers huge profits to Switzerland



- To respond to critics/build on previous research
  - Many had not accepted either Death and Taxes, or its follow up <u>False Profits</u> (2009)
  - Looked to use an <u>alternative</u> <u>methodology</u> to investigate MNC profit shifting
    - Who Pays the Price (2013)



- To help maximise media interest
  - UK media before G8 was very interested in stories about UK tax havens, but not linking them to development
  - UK tax havens are the largest provider of FDI to developing countries
    - <u>Invested Interests</u> (2013)



- To get issues onto/higher up the agenda
  - TJN-Africa Cost of Tax Incentives in East Africa – 2012
    - \$2.8bn a year being forfeit
  - Christian Aid survey of FTSE 100 companies attitudes on tax
    - To launch work stream on private sector and tax



#### How to do research

- Identify the questions
  - What problems do you want to highlight?
    - One country/global
    - One specific tax/law or more general
    - Government/corporate/individual control over the problem
  - What data do you have/can you get?
    - UNCTAD, IMF
    - Orbis (expensive corporate database)
    - Survey



#### How to do research

- Who will do the research
  - In house or by consultants/academics
    - Lack of awareness by NGOs of those willing and able to do research
- Who will verify
  - Peer review very useful helps address all the difficult questions/issues before publication



#### How to publish research

- Looking for headlines or for meaningful debate?
  - Media strategy vs. Roundtable discussion
  - Short and snappy vs. Longer and more detailed
    - Space to do both but takes time



#### What I wish was being done

- More surveys
  - we don't know enough about what is going on both in companies and developing country revenue authorities
- Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)
  - More detailed work on tax havens role in FDI
- Uncontroversial metrics on scale of tax abuse



Probably impossible
